

### Counterfeit Money—Halls Has It!

Counterfeit \$20 and \$50 bills have turned up in the Halls satellite of the Knox County Clerk's Office. Driver's License supervisor, Wanda Bailey went to the First Tennessee Bank with the deposit one day in late January and the teller noted the bogus bill. The bank kept the \$20 to turn over to law enforcement officers and Wanda called downtown to tell one of the managers about the transaction. Nobody is sure where the bill was actually passed, since the bank deposit was a combination of daily fees

The Knoxville office of the Secret Service donated several dozen brochures to help Deputy Clerk's spot bogus bills at the counter. While Chief Deputy Clerk, Bruce Whiteaker, was in the process of distributing the brochures, Halls Deputy Clerk Dee Dee Haynes received a \$50 counterfeit bill. "I thought the paper felt funny", Dee Dee explained. "And when I ran my special detection pen across the paper, the ink turned black." Haynes immedi-

ately took the bill to Wanda

with her detection pen. Then they realized the bill had already been checked once before. The customer who paid for his driver's license renewal with the bad bill explained that he got it in a handful of change from a north Knox county convenience store. Knox County Sheriff's deputies confiscated the bogus \$50 and wrote a report. The customer made the transaction good with a credit card payment. Wanda Bailey said a bank teller reported two bogus \$100 bills turned up in a previous deposit from another business in Halls that same week.
