KNOXVILLE – Trustee Ed Shouse wants to remind Knox County residents that Property Tax payments for the 2014 tax year are due Saturday, Feb. 28. However, due to inclement weather and Feb. 28 falling on a Saturday, the Knox County Trustee’s Office will accept 2014 tax payments without penalty Monday, March 2, either online or in person at the office’s downtown- and satellite locations.
