IN RE: CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Caldwell presided and called the meeting to order.

IN RE: REPORT OF EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

- Medical Holiday for Approved Disability by KCRPB Ms. Schroeder informed the Board the medical holiday policy will sunset on 6/30/2022 and would be extended to 6/30/2026.
- Minimum Required Distributions (MRD's) proceed for 2021 Minimum required distribution letters were mailed to participants over age 72.
- <u>Election for Employee Representative for KCRPB on February 10, 2022</u> Ms. Schroeder informed the Board that a special election will be held for an open County position on the Board on February 10th. Notification of the election was sent out on January 3rd. There were 5 petitions requested and 2 have been returned so far.
- Knox County Schools Classified Employees Ms. Schroeder reported that the Retirement Office had been talking to Schools and TCRS about the feasibility of classified employees being covered by the State hybrid plan, the same as new hired teachers. If Schools decides to pursue that, current classified Schools employees would have the choice of staying in our plans or starting to accrue future benefits with TCRS and all new classified employees would enter TCRS. School staff's proposal to make this change will require approval of the School Board and County Commission. Ms. Schroeder reviewed a proposed timeline for decision-making and told the Board she would keep them updated on any developments.
- Valuation Ms. Schroeder informed the Board that the valuation data had been sent to the actuary.
- Plan Summaries 4Q2021 Ms. Schroeder presented the updated plan summaries for the period ending 12/31/2021.
