WHEREAS, the citizens of Knox County recently suffered a great loss in the passing of Dr. Mary B. Duffy, who, for more than twenty-five years prior to her retirement on June 30, 1992, was Director of the Knox County Health Department; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Mary Duffy graduated from Allegheny College, received her M.D. degree from the University of Pennsylvania, and her M.P.H. from the University of North Carolina. She practiced

pediatric medicine in North Carolina and was certified by the American Board of Prevention Medicine; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Mary Duffy began her service with the Knox County Health Department in 1961 and in 1962 was named Assistant Director. In 1967 she was named director of the Knox County Health Department; and

WHEREAS, as Director of the Health Department, Dr. Duffy was active in numerous community agencies in which her expertise in public health was beneficial to the organizations. She was a board member for Senior Citizens Home Aide Services, Planned Parenthood, Knoxville City Nursery Schools, the East Tennessee Heart Association, and the Arthritis Foundation. She served as medical advisor for the Knox County Head Start Program, and was active in the East Tennessee Development District, East Tennessee Health Improvement Council, Community Action Committee, the East Tennessee Juvenile Service Center, and the Advisory Committee for the Community Improvement Program. She was also involved with Boy Scouts, Kiwanis, the Clean Air League, and several Parent-Teacher Associations. She was active in the Knoxville Academy of Medicine and served on various committees of the Academy; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Duffy served the community in areas of education by serving as a consultant for the University of Tennessee medical staff and as lecturer for the Family Practice Residency Program. In addition to this, she served as a parttime faculty member for the University of Tennessee College of Health, Safety and Leisure. She made the Health Department available as a clinical facility for medical, nutrition, nursing, and health education students from the University of Tennessee and other educational institutions; and

WHEREAS, during her career Dr. Duffy developed and implemented numerous public health programs. In addition to carrying out statewide programs, Dr. Duffy recognized local needs and established several pilot programs to promote the health care of Knox County citizens; and

WHEREAS, with a background in pediatrics and a primary concern for the health needs of children, Dr. Mary Duffy staffed clinics at the Health Department for school exams. She made nursing services available to children in schools, including screening programs, communicable disease control, and consultant services to parents and teachers. She had a special interest in providing services to children in day care centers and made available environmentalists, nurses and nutritionists to assist in building plans and maintenance, staff education in infection control, first aid, CPR and nutrition; and

WHEREAS, in 1974, under the director of Dr. Mary Duffy, a prenatal clinic was established at the Health Department. Comprehensive prenatal care was provided and patients were referred to a hospital for delivery. As the Knox County Health Department expanded clinic services, nurse practitioners provided care to approximately 900 patients a year. Knox County continues to provide a comprehensive prenatal program to serve patients who might not otherwise receive prenatal care; and

WHEREAS, over the years Dr. Mary Duffy expanded Health Education Programs to include health fairs and presentations to school and civic clubs. In 1985 the Health Department began to sponsor Students Against Driving Drunk (SADD) in the high schools. This program has now expanded to include middle schools; and

WHEREAS, under Dr. Duffy's direction, a licensed pharmacy and a licensed laboratory were established at the Health Department. In 1982 Knox County transferred the County Indigent Care Clinic to the Health Department. Dr. Mary Duffy directed this program and recruited the necessary medical staff. The indigent care program has provided care to nearly 9,000 patients and the clinic now averages 1,400 visits per month; and

WHEREAS, in 1979, under the leadership of Dr. Duffy, a new health department building was constructed and later three clinic sites were established; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Mary Duffy demonstrated exceptional abilities in developing and managing the Knox County Health Department. Her patient nature and compassion for others were always evident in her administration of the Knox County Health Department; and

WHEREAS, in 1988 Dr. Mary Duffy's exceptional talents, abilities, and achievements were recognized when she received the R.H. Hutcheson, Sr., M.D. Career Award; and in 1989 she received the Tennessee Medical Association Distinguished Service Award; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of this Commissin to honor the memory of Dr. Mary B. Duffy for her outstanding achievements and her success in developing the Knox County Health Department into the institution it is today.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION OF KNOX COUNTY AS FOLLOWS:

That this Commission honors the memory of Dr. Mary B. Duffy and expresses to her family on behalf of themselves and the citizens of Knox County, their heartfelt appreciation for the contributions of Dr. Mary B. Duffy to Knox County.
