## *Knox County offers Christmas tree recycling*

**What:** Christmas tree recycling, drop-off

**Background:** After the New Year, Knox County residents can bring their unwanted, live Christmas trees to participating Knox County Convenience Centers for free disposal.

Knox County residents will be able to drop off trees throughout the entire month of January at no cost. Trees must be cleaned of all ornaments, lights, wire, string and other decor before being delivered to a Center.

City of Knoxville residents can place their bare trees at the curb for pick-up by public service workers as time and resources allow during the ongoing leaf collection season.

Normal hours of operation for all Knox County Convenience Center are 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturday; they are closed on Sunday. The Centers will be closed on Monday, Dec. 24 and Tuesday, Dec. 25 in observance of Christmas, but will be open normal hours on Wednesday, Dec. 26. They will close again on Tuesday, Jan. 1, 2019, in observance of New Year's Day, but will be open normal hours again on Wednesday, Jan. 2, 2019.

Please note that Center users may experience higher than normal wait times during the holiday season.
