Mayor Jacobs Talks About Ballfields, Concerts, and SchoolMania

KNOXVILLE, Tenn.—During his Weekly Update, which will post around 1 p.m. today, Knox County Mayor Glenn Jacobs talks about a major South Knox County land donation, the Second Saturday Concert Series, his annual SchoolMania, and more.
