

PURPOSE

Knox County Grants and Community Development (KCGCD) is pleased to announce the Program Year 2025 (July 1, 2025 - June 30, 2026) grant applications for HUD Funded Programs and Projects. Programs and projects selected for funding will inform the development of the first Annual Action Plan for Knox County's 2025-2029 Consolidated Plan.

Funding for these grants are provided to Knox County from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The purpose of these funds is to support community development with a focus on building stronger and more resilient communities through affordable housing, suitable living environments, and expanding economic opportunities, principally for the benefit of Low-to-Moderate-Income (LMI) persons, families, and households.

AVAILABLE APPLICATIONS

Knox County seeks to address the needs of Knox County residents through two grant applications: Construction & Infrastructure Projects and HUD Programs.

CONSTRUCTION & INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS

Funding for Construction & Infrastructure projects will support the development and enhancement of affordable housing, specifically benefiting LMI residents. Eligible projects may involve emergency home repairs, accessibility improvements, and addressing critical capital needs. Additionally, funding can be allocated for property acquisition and comprehensive infrastructure enhancements, such as water and sewer system upgrades, street and sidewalk improvements, and utility enhancements in support of affordable housing development. This initiative aims to promote sustainable community development, enhance living conditions, and ensure safe, accessible, and well-maintained environments for all residents.

HUD PROGRAMS

Funding to support public service programs aimed at enhancing housing stability and addressing various community needs. This includes initiatives focused on preventing and responding to housing insecurity, homelessness, and domestic abuse, as well as programs that promote workforce development, education, mental and physical health, reentry, and youth development. Eligible projects may encompass support services, education, and assistance, specifically targeting LMI individuals, persons exiting the

criminal justice system, elderly persons, persons with disabilities, and individuals with limited English proficiency.

AVAILABLE FUNDING

Program Year 2025 funds will be from the County's HUD Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) entitlement funds. Based on Knox County's previous CDBG program funding, we anticipate receiving around \$1.1 million in CDBG entitlement funds for 2025. 20% will be set aside for administrative costs, 15% of the available funding will be granted to public service programs, and the remaining funds will be made available for construction and infrastructure projects.

The County expects to fund multiple applications and asks that applicants consider this while developing their funding request.

ESTIMATED FUNDING AVAILABLE

Construction & Infrastructure: ~\$715,000

HUD Programs (public services): ~ \$165,000

PROGRAM/PROJECT PERIOD

The project period will be July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Knox County is seeking applications from experienced organizations actively engaged in addressing community needs.

ORGANIZATION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. The organization must be located within and serving residents of Knox County.
- 2. The organization must have a Unique Entity ID (UEI) and be registered within the Federal System for Award Management (SAM) database at https://sam.gov.
- 3. The organization must be an incorporated non-profit entity registered with the TN Secretary of State and listed as "Active" at https://tnbear.tn.gov/Ecommerce/FilingSearch.aspx (this requirement does not apply to government agencies interested in applying).

PROGRAM AND PROJECT REQUIREMENTS

Funds must be used for activities that meet the following requirements:

- 1. Meet one of the following CDBG National Objectives:
 - a. Benefit low- and moderate-income persons

- b. Aid in the prevention or elimination of slums and blight
- c. Meet certain urgent community needs
- 2. Serve LMI persons or areas of high poverty in Knox County, outside the boundaries of the City of Knoxville and Town of Farragut.
- 3. Meeting the statutory requirements of HUD programs found in <u>24 CFR</u>.

ELIGIBLE CONSTRUCTION & INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS

- Acquisition of property
- Rental rehabilitation for the benefit of LMI residents
- Homeowner rehabilitation for the benefit of LMI residents
- Construction or improvements to infrastructure in support of affordable housing initiatives
- Development of rental housing for the benefit of LMI residents
- Development of owner-occupied housing for the benefit of LMI residents

Applications are submitted online through the Neighborly software portal utilized by KCGCD for subrecipient and contract management. Existing subrecipients may log in using their current credentials. New applicants must sign up for the portal. Neighborly registration information is included at the end of this notification.

SELECTION PROCESS

Application Screening: KCGCD will screen all applications to ensure that they meet the requirements included in the funding announcement.

Application Review: KCGCD will review applications to understand the overall demand and effectiveness of the program, utilizing the scoring rubrics included in this notification.

Final Decisions: KCGCD will consider rankings along with other factors to make final funding decisions. Other factors may include cost effectiveness, overall funds availability, county government priorities and strategies, federal or state regulations, community need, geographic distribution, balance of focuses and approaches, or other relevant factors. KCGCD may not fund all applications or may only award a portion of the amount requested. If funding requests exceed available funds, KCGCD may ask applicants to revise projects to a more limited focus.

Final Knox County Approval: Approval of any funding provided through Knox County is ultimately the decision of the County Mayor, with final approval provided by Knox County Commission.

HUD Approval: Knox County's 2025-2029 Consolidated Plan and Program Year 2025 Annual Action Plan must be approved before agencies can enter a contract with Knox County. The Action Plan details how Knox County will utilize HUD funding in the upcoming program year.

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS


Those selected for funding will be required to complete monthly reports (including demographic data and progress on goals) and reimbursement requests through KCGCD's online grant reporting system. Goals and performance indicators will be set for each contracted program/project.






CREATE YOUR ACCOUNT

When you access the Portal for the first time, you'll need to sign up for an account by clicking on the *Sign Up Now* link. The registration process will create a username (which is your work email address) and password that will be used for future logins. The email address you choose will also be used for system emails/notifications. For security purposes, the system will validate that you own the registered email address by sending an email with a validation link.

Note: If you do not receive the system email within 2 minutes, check your spam or bulk mail folder. If the email appears in that folder, you should right click on the email to indicate "Not Junk" or "Not Spam" to ensure you receive any other system notifications.






LOGGING IN

- 2: Minimum Response The application partially meets the criteria but lacks some important details or clarity.
- 1: Unsatisfactory Response The application minimally addresses the criteria with insufficient detail or clarity.
