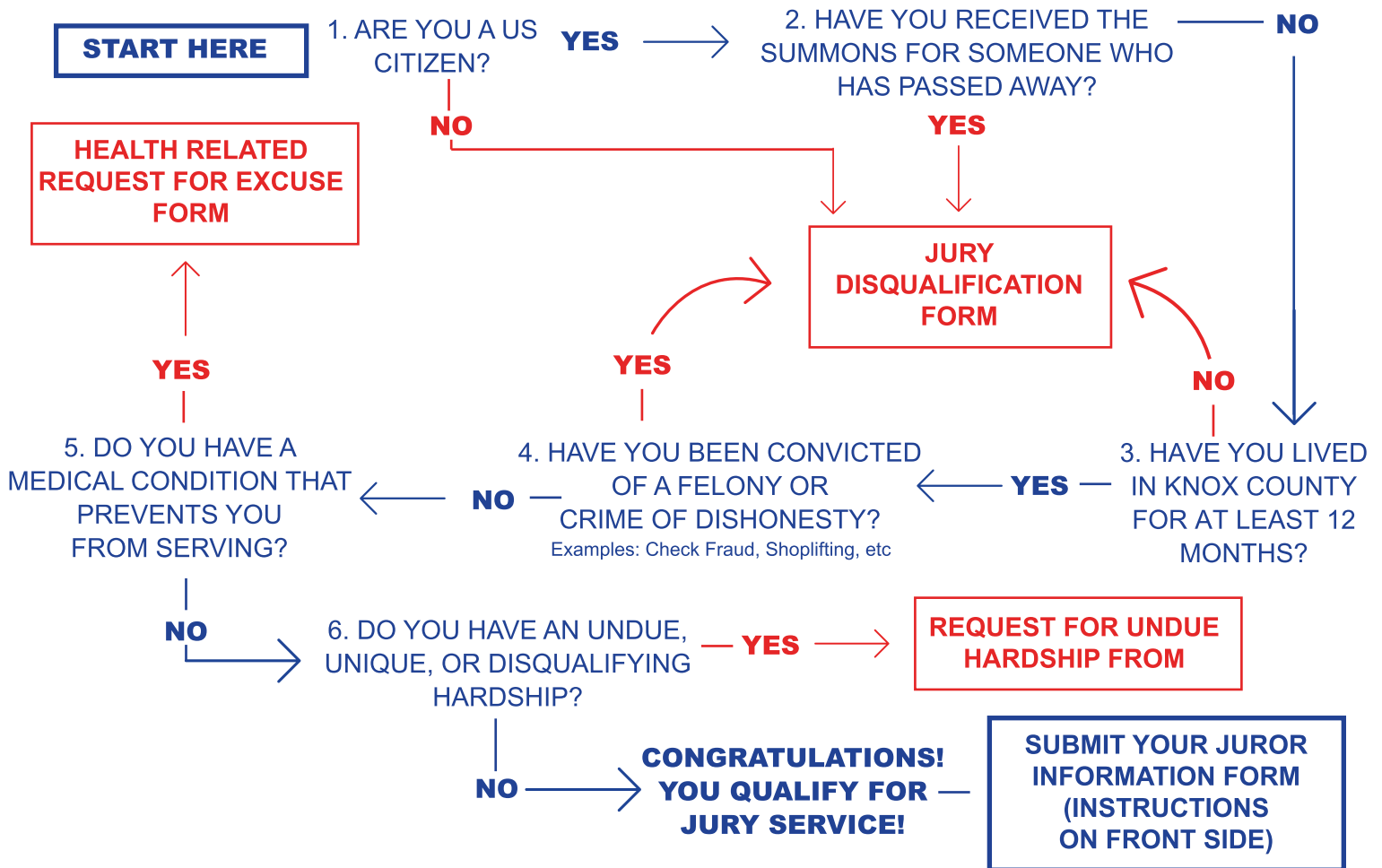


JURY SERVICE FORMS

You've received your juror summons mailing! Let's find out which form you need to complete and submit to Knox County Jury Services. Additional information regarding each form is available below.



Jury Disqualification Form

If you are not a US citizen, live outside of Knox County, or have been convicted of a felony or a Crime of Dishonesty, you are disqualified from serving as a Knox County juror. If one of these disqualifications applies to you, please complete the Jury Disqualification form in your summons mailing. You will also need to complete this form if you have received the summons on behalf of someone who has passed away. The Jury Disqualification Form is included in this summons mailing and available on our website. Please note that the Jury Disqualification Form must be notarized and submitted to Knox County Jury Services.

Health Related Request for Excuse Form

If you have a medical condition that prevents you from serving on a jury, please have your licensed physician complete the Health-Related Request for Excuse Form, available in your jury summons mailing or on our website. Please note that we will only accept the form if it has been completed and submitted by your physician.

Request for Undue Hardship Form

If you have an undue, disqualifying, or extreme hardship, you may be excused from jury service. If an undue hardship applies to you, please fill out the Request for Undue Hardship Form included in your summons mailing or our website. Please note that only a judge can excuse you from jury service. We recommend being as thorough and detailed as possible about your circumstances to decrease the likelihood of needing additional supporting documentation. We will contact you within 3-5 business days with the Judge's decision.
