Knox County, Tenn. – Knox County has seen nearly 50 heat-related visits to area emergency rooms since the beginning of June. Heat-related illnesses, such as heat exhaustion or heat stroke, happen when the body is not able to properly cool itself.

Signs and symptoms of heat-related illness include:

- Muscle cramps
- Weakness
- Heavy sweating
- Nausea and/or vomiting
- Paleness
- Red, dry skin
- · Rapid pulse
- Dizziness
- Nausea
- Confusion

Heat-related illnesses are preventable by:

- Staying cool
- Wearing light-colored, loose-fitting, breathable clothing
- Staying hydrated
- Limiting outdoor activities to cooler times of the day
- Taking frequent breaks in the shade if you must be in the sun for work/sports/activities

Children, older adults, people with disabilities and those who work routinely outside are at higher risk for heat-related illnesses. Check on those who are at higher risk and ensure they maintain proper hydration. For those looking for public places and activities that offer air-conditioning and shelter from the sun, we encourage people to seek out Knox County <u>libraires</u> and <u>senior centers</u>.
