The following is for clarification:

- Q1. Is Proposal solely for Anatomic Pathology work?
- A1. There is an optional Transcription schedule included in the RFP. Testing will only be decedents.
- Q2. Regarding Section 4.1.1, please clarify what is meant by tissue blocks and how far are you along in the processing?
- A2. Amend "tissue blocks" to read "tissue cassettes." The blocks are the paraffin blocks that are returned from histology.
- Q3. Regarding Section 4.1.2, please clarify what the RFC procedures are and provide a copy.
- A3. The RFC procedures in this section refer to histology types of testing done in association with autopsy. It is not in reference to written policies and/or procedures. In reference to histology, we provide a Slide Key to accompany the tissue cassettes. The requisitions are for Special stains or additional requests.
- Q4. Regarding Section 4.1.2, please clarify electronic requisitions of what?
- A4. We prefer to electronically complete our requisitions of whatever test being requested but we could utilize paper forms.
- Q5. Section 4.1.5 mentions whole slide imaging with internet access to digital slide images and that slide images must be available to forensic pathologists for diagnostic work or photomicrography. Is this a requirement?
- A5. Our pathologists sometimes prefer to have digital slide images for viewing and presentation. It is not a requirement.
- Q6. Section 4.1.6 references routine cultures (blood and/or tissue and/or CSF). Please clarify whether there is an expected turnaround time?

A6. Yes. Within 5 days or within 2 days of the completion of testing.



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- Q7. Section 4.1.7 references nasopharyngeal (viral) cultures. Please clarify whether there is an expected turnaround time?
- A7. Yes. Within 5 days or within 2 days of the completion of testing.
- Q8. Section 4.1.8 references Tryptase (concentration in blood) that is no longer available.
- A8. If tryptase testing not available, please state so under the "Exceptions" tab of your proposal.
- Q9. Section 4.1.9 references exposure and donation cases (HEP and HIV). Is this clinical testing instead of Anatomic Pathology testing?
- A9. Such testing would only be performed on the source patient (decedent).
- Q10. What is the name of the pathology electronic medical record software?
- A10. MDILog
- Q11. Who is the medical director/pathology group overseeing this?
- A11. The Medical Director is Dr. Darinka Mileusnic-Polchan.
- Q12. Do you have an approximate number of blocks per day?
- A12. The number varies from 5 to 50 blocks per day.
- Q13. Describe the requirements for possible chain of custody cases that may need any kind of litigation.
- A13. These would be normal chain of custody cases for labs handling homicide cases.
