- **1.7** <u>**CLOSURES:**</u> During periods of closure due to unforeseen circumstances in Knox County or closures at the direction of the Knox County Mayor, the Procurement Division will enact the following procedures in regards to solicitations and weather delays:

- **1.12 <u>ELECTRONIC TRANSMISSION OF PROPOSALS</u>: Knox County's Procurement Division <u>will not</u> accept electronically transmitted proposals. Facsimile and email submissions are strictly prohibited. Due to the nature of the information requested, all submissions shall be in written format.**
- 1.13 <u>HOW TO DO BUSINESS:</u> Knox County utilizes a web-based Procurement software system, "Knox Procurement On-Line." The system provides our clients (vendors, county departments and the citizens of Knox County) with a more enhanced and end-user friendly means of accessing our services. The system allows for on-line vendor registration and maintenance, electronic receipt of Purchase Orders, on-line retrieval and submittal of quotes for our vendor-clients and on-line requisitioning and receiving for our county departments.

- **1.14 INCURRED COSTS:** Knox County will not be responsible for any costs incurred by the proposer in the preparation of their proposal.
- **1.15** <u>NON-COLLUSION:</u> Proposers, by submitting a signed proposal, certify that the accompanying proposal is not the result of, or affected by, any unlawful act of collusion with any other person or company engaged in the same line of business or commerce, or any other fraudulent act punishable under Tennessee or United States law.
- **1.16 PAYMENT METHOD:** Knox County utilizes two (2) methods of placing order for products and/or services. The first is the use of Purchase Orders. These Purchase Orders will be issued from the Knox County Procurement Division via the method selected by the vendor during registration. The Purchase Order will detail the quantity, specific item(s) and the contracted price for each item.

- **1.18 PROCESSING TIME FOR PAYMENT:** Vendors are advised that a minimum of thirty (30) days is required to process invoices for payment.
- **1.19 PROOF OF FINANCIAL AND BUSINESS CAPABILITY:** Vendors must, upon request, furnish satisfactory evidence of their ability to furnish products or services in accordance with the terms and conditions of these specifications. Knox County will make the final determination as to the vendor's ability.
- **1.20 PROPOSAL DELIVERY:** Knox County requires proposers, when hand delivering proposals, to time and date stamp the envelope before depositing it in the bid box. Knox County will not be responsible for any lost or misdirected mail sent by common carrier, nor will Knox County be responsible for proposals delivered to addresses other than the delivery address specified at the top of this solicitation. The time clock in the Procurement Division shall serve as the official record of time.

Solicitations must be in a <u>sealed</u> envelope/box prior to entering the Procurement Division office. Procurement Division personnel are not allowed to see the submittal nor assist in placing documents in an envelope/box. - **1.22 RESTRICTIVE OR AMBIGUOUS SPECIFICATIONS:** It is the responsibility of the prospective proposer to review the entire Request for Proposalss (RFP) packet and to notify the Procurement Division if the specifications are formulated in a manner that would unnecessarily restrict competition. Any such protest or question regarding the specifications or proposing procedures must be received in the Procurement Division by May 21, 2020 at 4:30 p.m. local time. These requirements also apply to specifications that are ambiguous.
- **1.23 SIGNING OF PROPOSALS:** In order to be considered, all proposals must be signed. <u>Please sign the original in</u> <u>blue ink.</u> By signing the proposal document, the vendor acknowledges and accepts the terms and conditions stated in the proposal document.
- **1.24 TAXES:** Knox County purchases are not subject to taxation. Tax exemption certificates will be provided upon request.
- 1.25 TITLE VI OF THE 1964 CIVIL RIGHTS ACT AND TITLE IX OF THE EDUCATIONAL AMENDMENT OF 1972:
 - "Nondiscrimination in Federally Assisted Programs"—"No person in the United States shall, on the ground of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance." 42 U.S.C. Section 2000. It is the policy of Knox County Government that all its services and activities be administered in conformance with the requirements of Title VI and Title IX.
- **1.26 USE OF PROPOSAL FORMS:** Vendors must complete the proposal forms contained in the proposal package. Failure to complete the proposal forms may result in proposal rejection.
- **1.27 VENDOR DEFAULT:** Knox County reserves the right, in case of vendor default, to procure the articles or services from other sources and hold the defaulting vendor responsible for any excess costs occasioned thereby. Should vendor default be due to a failure to perform or because of a request for a price increase, Knox County reserves the right to remove the vendor from the County's bidder's list for twenty-four (24) months.
- **1.28** <u>VENDOR REGISTRATION</u>: Prior to the closing of this proposal, *ALL PROPOSERS* must be registered with the Procurement Division. Please register on-line at our website at <u>www.knoxcounty.org/procurement</u> and click on "Online Vendor Registration."

Vendors must be registered with the Procurement Division *prior* to submitting their proposal. Knox County shall not be responsible for technical difficulties experienced by vendors trying to register electronically less than twenty-four (24) hours prior to the proposal closing time.

1.29 WAIVING OF INFORMALITIES: Knox County reserves the right to waive minor informalities or technicalities when it is in the best interest of Knox County.

SECTION II OBLIGATIONS, RIGHTS AND REMEDIES

These terms and conditions shall be part of the Contract. Knox County reserves the right to negotiate other terms and conditions it deems appropriate and necessary under the circumstances to protect the public's trust.

- 2.1 <u>ALTERATIONS OR AMENDMENTS:</u> No alterations, amendments, changes, modifications or additions to this Contract shall be binding on Knox County without the prior written approval of the County.
- 2.2 <u>APPROPRIATION:</u> In the event no funds are appropriated by Knox County for the goods or services in any fiscal year, or insufficient funds exist to purchase the goods or services, then the Contract shall expire upon the expenditure of previously appropriated funds or the end of the current fiscal year, whichever occurs first, with no further obligations owed to or by either party.
- **2.3** <u>ASSIGNMENT:</u> Contractor shall not assign or sub-contract this agreement, its obligations or rights hereunder to any party, company, partnership, incorporation or person without the prior written specific consent of Knox County.
- 2.4 <u>BOOKS AND RECORDS:</u> Vendor shall maintain all books, documents, accounting records and other evidence pertaining to the goods and services provided under this Contract and make such materials available at its offices at all reasonable times during the Contract period and for three (3) years from the date of the final payment under this agreement for inspection by County or by any other governmental entity or agency participating in the funding of this agreement, or any authorized agents thereof; copies of said records to be furnished if requested. Such records shall not include those books, documents and accounting records that represent the Vendor's costs of manufacturing, acquiring or delivering the products and services governed by this agreement.
- **2.5** CHILD LABOR: Contractor agrees that no products or services will be provided or performed under this Contract that have been manufactured or assembled by child labor.
- 2.6 <u>COMPLIANCE WITH ALL LAWS</u>: Contractor is assumed to be familiar with and agrees to observe and comply with all Federal, State, and Local laws, statutes, ordinances, and regulations in any manner affecting the provision of goods and/or services, and all instructions and prohibitive orders issued regarding this work and shall obtain all necessary permits.
- 2.7 <u>CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK:</u> Any and all successful proposers, Contractor's employees, Contractor's sub-contractors and the employees of any sub-contractors must submit to a criminal history records check at the Contractor's expense, conducted by the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation and the Federal Bureau of Investigation prior to permitting the employee to have contact with students or enter school grounds when students are present. Reference Tennessee Code Annotated Section 49-5-413. Proposers <u>must</u> submit with their proposals the Criminal History Affidavit of Compliance.
- 2.8 <u>DEFAULT:</u> If Contractor fails to perform or comply with any provision of this Contract or the terms or conditions of any documents referenced and made a part hereof, Knox County may terminate this Contract, in whole or in part, and may consider such failure or noncompliance a breach of Contract. Knox County expressly retains all its rights and remedies provided by law in case of such breach, and no action by Knox County shall constitute a waiver of any such rights or remedies. In the event of termination for default, Knox County reserves the right to purchase its requirements elsewhere, with or without competitive solicitation.
- 2.9 <u>GOVERNING LAW:</u> The laws of the State of Tennessee shall govern this Contract, and all obligations of the parties are performable in Knox County, Tennessee. The Chancery Court and/or the Circuit Court of Knox County, Tennessee, shall have exclusive and concurrent jurisdiction of any dispute which arises hereunder.
- **2.10 INCORPORATION:** All specifications, drawings, technical information, Request for Proposals, Proposal, Award and similar items referred to or attached or which are the basis for this Contract are deemed incorporated by reference as if set out fully herein.

- 2.11 <u>INDEMNIFICATION—HOLD HARMLESS:</u> Contractor shall indemnify, defend, save and hold harmless Knox County, its officers, agents and employees from all suits, claims, actions or damages of any nature brought because of, arising out of, or due to breach of the agreement by Contractor, its subcontractors, suppliers, agents, or employees or due to any negligent act or occurrence or any omission or commission of Contractor, its subcontractors, suppliers, agents or employees.
- **2.12 INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR:** Contractor shall acknowledge that it and its employees serve as independent contractors and that Knox County shall not be responsible for any payment, insurance or incurred liability.
- 2.13 **INSPECTION AND ACCEPTANCE:** Warranty periods shall not commence until Knox County inspects and formally accepts the goods and/or services. The terms, conditions and timing of acceptance shall be determined by Knox County. Knox County reserves the right to reject any or all items or services not in conformance with applicable specifications, and Contractor assumes the costs associated with such nonconformance. Acceptance of goods or services does not constitute a waiver of latent or hidden defects or defects not readily detectable by a reasonable person under the circumstances.
- 2.14 **IRAN DIVESTMENT ACT:** By submission of this RFP response, each proposer and each person signing on behalf of any proposer certifies, and in the case of a joint response, each party thereto certifies as to its own organization, under penalty of perjury, that to the best of its knowledge and belief that each proposer is not on the list created pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated § 12-12-106.
- 2.15 <u>LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY</u>: In no event shall Knox County be liable for any indirect, incidental, consequential, special or exemplary damages or lost profits, even if Knox County has been advised of the possibility of such damages.
- 2.16 <u>NON-DISCRIMINATION AND NON-CONFLICT STATEMENT:</u> Contractor agrees that no person on the grounds of handicap, age, race, color, religion, sex, national origin or any individual trait or characteristic found to be an illegal consideration, shall be excluded from participation in, or be denied benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination in the performance of this agreement or in the employment practices of vendor. Contractor shall upon request show proof of such non-discrimination. Contractor covenants that it complies with the Fair Wage and Hour Laws, the National Labor Relations Act, and other Federal and State employment laws as applicable. Contractor covenants that it does not engage in any illegal employment practices.

Contractor covenants that it has no public or private interest and shall not acquire directly or indirectly any interest that would conflict in any manner with the provision of its goods or performance of its services. Contractor warrants that no part of the total Contract amount provided herein shall be paid directly or indirectly to any officer or employee of Knox County as wages, compensation, or gifts in exchange for acting as officer, agent, employee, subcontractor or consultant to Contractor in connection with any goods provided or work contemplated or performed relative to the agreement.

- 2.17 ORDER OF PRECEDENCE: In the event of inconsistent or conflicting provision of this Contract and referenced documents, the following descending order of precedence shall prevail: (1) Contract, (2) Request for Proposals, (3) Contractor's Response, (4) Award, (5) Special Terms and Conditions, (6) General Terms and Conditions, (7) Specifications, (8) Drawings.
- **2.18** <u>**REMEDIES:**</u> Knox County shall have all rights and remedies afforded under the U.C.C. and Tennessee law in Contract and in tort, including but not limited to, rejection of goods, rescission, and right of set-off, refund, incidental, consequential and compensatory damages and reasonable attorney's fees.
- **2.19 <u>RIGHT TO INSPECT:**</u> Knox County reserves the right to make periodic inspections of the manner and means the service is performed or the goods are supplied and warehoused.
- **2.20** <u>SEVERABILITY:</u> If any provision of this Contract is declared illegal, void or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall not be affected but shall remain in force and in effect.
- 2.21 <u>TAX COMPLIANCE:</u> Pursuant to Resolution R-07-1-903 passed by the Commission of Knox County, Tennessee, Contractor hereby acknowledges, by submission of its proposal or proposal and signature, it is current in its respective Federal, State, County, and City taxes of whatever kind or nature, and is not delinquent in any way. Delinquent status must be disclosed or risk debarment by the Knox County Procurement Division.

- **2.22** <u>**TERMINATION:**</u> County may terminate this agreement with or without cause at anytime. In the event of termination by either party, fees due for services satisfactorily performed or goods accepted prior to the termination date shall be paid.
- **2.23** <u>WARRANTY:</u> Contractor warrants to Knox County that all items delivered and all services rendered shall conform to the specifications, drawings, solicitation and/or other descriptions furnished and/or incorporated by reference, and will be fit for the particular purpose purchased of merchantable quality, good workmanship, and free from defects.

SECTION III SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- **3.1 <u>INTENT:</u>** The intent of this document is to set forth and convey to prospective proposers the general requirements for vendors to provide Knox County Schools with Travel Management Services as desired by Knox County and Knox County Schools. Award will be based on Best Value. Best value means more than low cost. It includes cost, technical service quality, experience, qualifications and other factors detailed herein.
- **3.2** <u>ACCEPTANCE:</u> Vendors are advised that the payment of an invoice does not necessarily constitute as an acceptance of services that are provided. Acceptance requires a specific written action by Knox County so stating.
- **3.3** <u>ADDITIONS OR DELETIONS:</u> Knox County reserves the right to add services as the need arises or to delete services that have become obsolete in demand. If services are to be added, Knox County and the Contractor will arrive at a mutually agreed price. Any additions or deletions must be approved in writing by Knox County Procurement prior to any changes in service.
- **3.4** <u>AGENCY CONTACTS:</u> The Contractor will be given a list of key personnel directly associated with the services to be performed for contact information. Only the Knox County Procurement Division will have the authority to make changes during the term of this agreement and in compliance with any resulting Contract.
- **3.5** <u>AWARD LENGTH:</u> The length of this Contract will be three (3) years with the option to renew upon mutual consent of both parties. The term agreement may be renewed for an additional two (2) years, for a possible total of five (5) years. Knox County reserves the right to purchase these products and/or services from other sources if the need arises. Knox County reserves the right to revoke the award if a pattern of unavailability arises with the vendor.
- **3.6** CHANGES AFTER AWARD: It is possible that after award, Knox County might change its needs or requirements. Knox County reserves the right to make such changes after consultation with the vendor. Should additional costs arise, Knox County reserves the right to consider accepting these charges provided the vendor can document the increased costs. Knox County also reserves the right to accept proposed service changes from the vendor if they will lower the cost to Knox County and/or provide improved service.
- **3.7** <u>COMMUNICATIONS:</u> The successful execution of this contract will require extensive communication between all involved parties. While information may be transmitted via telephone, it should always be followed up with a fax transmission or email. It is essential that the Contractor have an efficient and properly working fax machine as well as email capabilities. The Contractor will be required to submit a list of individuals, along with direct phone numbers, cell phone numbers, fax numbers and email addresses for the agency's contacts.

These individuals must be familiar with the Knox County Contract and have authority to make adjustments as requested by Knox County.

- **3.8** <u>COMPLIANCE WITH ALL APPLICABLE REGULATIONS</u>: Vendor agrees and covenants that the company, its agents and employees will comply with all City, County, State and Federal codes, laws, rules and regulations applicable to the business to be conducted under this contract. If the vendor performs any work knowing it to be contrary to such laws, ordinances, rules and regulations, the vendor shall bear all costs arising from such work.
- 3.9 <u>CONTRACT EXECUTION:</u> The award of this proposal may result in a Contract between Knox County and the successful Vendor(s). The Contract may require Knox County Board of Education and/or Knox County Commission approval. The successful Vendor(s) may be required to be present at the Board of Education and/or County Commission meeting(s) to answer questions relating to the service to be performed. Adequate notification will be given by Knox County Procurement Division if the awarded vendor(s) will need to attend meetings. There shall be no cost to Knox County for attendance of the Vendor(s). Knox County will draft the Contract. The Knox

County Procurement Division <u>will not</u> accept any vendor's contract. If Master Agreements, Service Agreements, Terms and Conditions or other contract agreements are submitted they will not be accepted.

- **3.10 CONTACT PERSONNEL:** Essential to the success of this Contract is the development of a good working relationship between the Vendor and Knox County. It is imperative that the Knox County account be handled efficiently and professionally. Knox County should be assigned no more than two (2) Vendor contacts to handle billing inquiries and service related issues. In the event on or both contacts leave the Knox County account, the Vendor shall formally introduce the new contacts to Knox County personnel. These contacts must be knowledgeable of the County's account to avoid an interruption of service.
- 3.11 **CONTRACTOR DUTIES:** At the Contractor's own expense, the Contractor shall:
 - **3.11.1** Provide competent supervision;
 - **3.11.2** Provide competent personnel;
 - **3.11.3** Take precautions necessary to protect persons or property against injury or damage and be responsible for any such damage or injury that occurs as a result of their fault or negligence.
- 3.12 **EVALUATION CRITERIA:** This proposal will be evaluated using the following criteria:

Quality of Available Services	30 Points
Proposed Cost	30 Points

- **3.13 EVALUATION REVIEW:** Knox County reserves the right to use all pertinent information that might affect the County's judgment as to the appropriateness of an award to the best evaluated Vendor(s). This information may be appended to the proposal evaluation process results. Information on a service provider from reliable sources, and not within the service provider's proposal, may also be noted and made part of the evaluation file. Knox County shall have sole responsibility for determining a reliable source. Knox County reserves the right to conduct written and/or oral discussions/interviews after the proposal closing. The purpose of such discussions/interviews is to provide clarification and/or additional information to make an award that is in the best interest of Knox County.
- **3.14 EXCEPTIONS TO SPECIFICATIONS:** Vendors taking exception to any part or section of these specifications shall indicate such exceptions on their submittal. A failure to indicate any exception(s) shall be interpreted as the Vendor's intent to fully comply with the specifications as written. Conditional or qualified offer are subject to rejection in whole or in part. Any exceptions shall be included in Tab VII of the submittal. Do not strike through or in any other way alter the RFP. Exceptions listed within other sections of the submittal shall not be reviewed or considered.
- **3.15 GRATUITIES AND KICKBACKS:** It shall be a breach of ethical standards for any person or company to offer, give, or agree to give any employee or former employee, or for any employee or former employee to solicit, demand, accept, or agree to accept from another person, a gratuity or an offer of employment in connection with any decision, approval, disapproval, recommendation, preparation of any part of a program requirement or a purchase request, influencing the content of any specification or procurement standard, rendering of advice, investigation, auditing or in any other advisory capacity in any proceeding or application, request for ruling, determination, claim, or controversy or other particular matter, pertaining to any program requirement of a contract or subcontract or to any solicitation or proposal therefore. It shall be a breach of ethical standards for any payment, gratuity or offer of employment to be made by or on behalf of a subcontractor under a contract to the prime contractor or higher tier subcontractor or a person associated therewith, as an inducement for the award of a subcontract or order. Breach of the provisions of this paragraph is, in addition to a breach of this Contract, a breach of ethical standards which may result in civil or criminal sanction and/or debarment or suspension from being a contractor or subcontractor under Knox County contracts.
- **3.16 IDENTIFICATION:** Employees of the Contractor shall have proper photo identification displayed at all times while on property belonging to Knox County.
- **3.17 INVOICE DETAIL:** Knox County is requesting invoices to show the following detail to help expedite review and payment. The Contractor(s) may be required to modify invoicing procedures to show the detail. All potential Contractors are hereby cautioned that Knox County will only pay from original invoices and not facsimiles or copies. Invoices which do not adhere to these details may be returned to the Contractor for correction.
 - 3.17.1 The invoice must show the amount due to the Contractor by Knox County;
 - **3.17.2** The invoice must show a summary of completed work;

- 3.17.3 Invoices are to be original and uniquely pre-numbered;
- **3.17.4** Invoices which do not show this information are subject to rejection.
- **3.18 INVOICING PROCEDURES:** Knox County requests that invoices be easy to read and understand. Invoices are to be original and uniquely pre-numbered. Each participating agency to this Contract may be required to use different invoicing information and procedures. This information and procedures shall be provided to the contractor(s) prior to Contract execution. There shall be no additional charge for this information and procedures to be included.

Each invoice shall include a summary of service(s) provided and shall list the associated unit price. Supporting documentation shall be included with invoices as applicable. Invoices without this information will be returned to the Contractor for correction.

Invoices shall be sent to the billing address indicated on the Purchase Order. Each department or division of Knox County is responsible for its own budget. Departments cannot charge or pay bills for another department. Therefore, it is critical that the successful Contractor's invoices specify the correct department. Do not credit payments to another department's account. Invoices must be submitted in triplicate and must match the corresponding Purchase Order number. There shall be no component billing. 3.19 INVOICE REVIEW: Knox County shall review all invoices for adherence to the terms and conditions of the Contract. Variations from the Contract and Contract pricing are strictly prohibited. Any variance found on the invoice will result in rejection of that invoice. Rejected invoices will be returned to the Contractor(s) for correction. Repeated variations may result in termination.

3.20 MINIMUM QUALIFICATION EXPECTATIONS:

- **3.20.1** Respondent must have the experience and capabilities to carry out the work contemplated and equipment and personnel available for the work.
- **3.20.2** If the respondent has a permanent office in Knox County, respondent must have a current business license issued by Knox County. This requirement also applies to any of the Respondent's proposed sub-contractors or sub-consultants with a permanent office in Knox County. A Knox County business license is not required of any Respondent or proposed sub-contractor or sub-consultant who does not have a permanent office in Knox County. - **3.21 NEGOTIATION:** Knox County may select a successful proposer on the basis of initial offers received without discussions. Therefore, each proposal shall contain the proposer's best terms from a cost or price and service standpoint. Knox County reserves the right to enter into Contract negotiations, including, but not limited to, rates and term, with the highest-rated proposer. If Knox County and the selected proposer cannot negotiate a successful agreement, Knox County may terminate said negotiations and begin negotiations with the next highest-rated proposer. Knox County retains the right to negotiate with multiple proposers simultaneously. This process will continue until an agreement has been reached or all proposers have been rejected. No proposer shall have any rights against Knox County arising from such negotiations.
- **3.22** <u>NEWS RELEASES BY VENDORS:</u> As a matter of policy, Knox County does not endorse the services of a Contractor. A Contractor will not make news releases concerning any resultant contract from this solicitation without the prior written approval of Knox County.
- **3.23 NO CONTACT POLICY:** After the date and time that the vendor receives this solicitation, any contact initiated by4any proposer with any Knox County representative, other than the Procurement Division representative listed herein, concerning this Request for Proposals, is strictly prohibited. Any such unauthorized contact may cause the disqualification of the proposer from this procurement transaction.
- **3.24** OFFER WITHDRAWAL: No proposal can be withdrawn after it is filed unless the proposer makes a request in writing to the Knox County Procurement Division prior to the time set for the closing of proposals or unless the County fails to accept within ninety (90) business days after the date fixed for the closing the RFP.

3.25 PRICING: The proposer(s) warrants that the unit price stated shall remain firm for a period of thirty-six (36) months from the first day of the Contract period.

If the Contractor's price is increased after the first contract period, Knox County must be given a written notice to consider. Such a request shall include as a minimum, (1) the cause for the adjustment; (2) the amount of the change requested with documentation to support the requested adjustment. Price increases will only be considered at the renewal period(s). If the price increase is rejected the contractor may:

- Continue with the existing prices;
- Request a lower price increase;
- Not accept the renewal offer.

If a price increase is approved by Knox County, the approval notification will be done in writing and the Contractor will be notified of the new price schedule and effective date of increase. This documentation will become part of the proposal file. No approvals will be authorized verbally.

- **3.27 PROPOSAL EVALUATION:** In evaluation of submitted proposals, Knox County reserves the right to use any or all of the ideas from the proposals submitted without limitation and to accept any part or the entire successful proposal in selecting an operation which is judged to be in the best interest of Knox County. All material submitted becomes property of Knox County.
- **3.28 PROPOSAL FORMAT:** This solicitation is in the Request for Proposals (RFP) format. As the specified date and time, each proposer's name will be publicly read aloud. No further information will be given at that time. Evaluation of the proposals will proceed as expeditiously as possible and successful, as well as unsuccessful, notification will be given.
- **3.29 PROPOSER INTERVIEWS:** Knox County reserves the right to request proposers to demonstrate their capabilities from those displaying a thorough knowledge of the intent of this RFP. The purpose of these interviews is to gain additional insight into the capabilities and feature of the proposed services and to ask questions regarding aspect of the same.
- **3.30 PROPOSER OBLIGATION:** Proposers shall become fully acquainted with conditions relating to the scope of the work detailed in this RFP. Failure to become acquainted with the existing conditions shall in no way absolve the proposer of any obligations with respect to this RFP or the Contract.
- **3.31 PUBLIC RECORDS ACT:** Knox County is subject to the Tennessee Open Records Act 10-7-503 et seq. Proposers are cautioned that all documents submitted on behalf of this Request for Proposals shall be open to the public for viewing and inspection.
- **3.32 <u>QUANTITIES:</u>** Knox County does not guarantee any quantity of services will be utilized under this solicitation. Services will be utilized on an as needed basis.
- **3.33 REJECTION OF PROPOSALS:** Knox County reserves the right to reject any and all proposals received as a result of this request and to waive any informality, technical defect or clerical error in any proposal, as the interests of Knox County may require. Non-acceptance of any proposal will be devoid of any criticism of the proposal and of any implication that the proposal is deficient in any manner.

Non-acceptance of any proposal shall be construed as meaning simply that the County does not deem the proposal acceptable or that another proposal was deemed more advantageous to Knox County for the particular services proposed.

- **3.34 <u>REMOVAL OF CONTRACTOR'S EMPLOYEES:</u>** Contractor agrees to utilize only experienced, responsible and capable people in the performance of the work. Knox County may require that the Contractor remove from the job covered by this Contract, employees who endanger persons or property or whose continued employment under this Contract is inconsistent with the interest of Knox County.

SECTION IV SCOPE OF WORK

4.1 BACKGROUND: Knox County Schools (KCS) is a public education agency. It is responsible for the education of children from preschool through high school. There are approximately fifty-nine thousand (59,000) Pre-K through 12th-grade students and approximately seven thousand eight hundred (7,800) employees. For purposes related to this RFP, the district is comprised of ninety-two (92) schools that represent urban, suburban, and rural populations.

KCS business that requires travel is typically a direct result of professional development seminars, conferences, and trainings. We do not have frequent travelers that would make regularly scheduled monthly/quarterly trips. KCS hasn't historically and doesn't currently use Travel Management Services for hotel bookings and car rentals. Air travel booking on average for the previous five (5) years is around \$150,000 per year. Note that this number may be significantly lower for the next year or two as a direct result of COVID-19. Anticipated International travel over the life of the contract would be limited to none.

4.2 SCOPE OF WORK: Vendor shall provide sourcing and procurement of lowest available airline reservations. While hotel and rental car reservations are not typical, they may be requested at some point. Reservations should be managed and checked by a quality control program for accuracy to ensure dates, times, destinations etc. are correct. Vendor must provide after-hours 24/7 emergency services and tracking for unused airline tickets/credits. Vendor must provide management reporting and accounting data as requested.

Beyond the basic services detailed above, Knox County will look at other value-added services which may include:

- Online booking tool and/or automated expense system
- Duty of Care traveler tracking and communication tool for emergencies and itinerary updates
- Free mobile app for smart phones to book travel or fill out and submit/approve expense reports
- Alternate faring and routing techniques by agents with more than 25 years' experience
- 24 Hour Emergency Support Center with an agent ready to assist, never a voicemail or answering machine
- Travel agency Global Distribution system housing all travel content, rates and inventory
- Automated low rate search system for hotel bookings
- Online group, meeting and incentive registration tool used to consolidate and organize group movements
- Global Hotel Program in all tier categories
- Visa & Passport Department
- Charter Air Management
